

GEORGE SPROULE AWARD PRESENTED TO LÉO-GUY LEBLANC

We are pleased to announce that **Léo-Guy LeBlanc, NBLs**, has been awarded the ANBLS' **George Sproule Award**. This award, named in honour of the province's first Surveyor-General (1784 – 1817), is presented to persons who have exhibited an outstanding contribution to the profession of Land Surveying. The George Sproule Award has only been awarded to a select few: Archie McLaughlin (1983), Willis Roberts (1988), Ralph Brown (1997) and Roger Gaudet (2005).

The award was presented to Léo-Guy on January 22nd during the Association's 57th Annual General Meeting.
